**Guest Reports or Communications** 

Physical Education Programs CUESD & LUHSD

Nancy Davis discussed that every site now has PE teachers and with that their roles to motivate students' to keep their minds and bodies healthy, support classroom teachers, are member of school wellness committee, and planning school wide activity such as a Color Run. Mr. Addington stressed the importance of ensuring that all schools have equitable access of all programs. He recognizes the importance of music programs being reintroduced to Central and Stratford.

Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics (STEM) Program- Central & Stratford 7. Nancy Davis discussed that Central and Stratford share 1 STEM teacher and they go to her classroom for instruction yet homeroom teachers are still conducting STEM activities. The goal is that students are engaged in inquiry based lessons and then talking about their learning to their families.

Parent/Community Volunteer Process for CUESD & LUHSD 8.

# **Hallway Monitoring Procedures**

- During passing periods, teachers stand outside their classroom doors to monitor the hallways.
- Administrators are present in the hallways during passing periods when possible.
- Teachers escort students to the cafeteria, library, computer lab, assemblies, and the bus.
- Yard supervisors are posted at the ends of the hallways during recess times.

# **Bathroom Monitoring Procedures**

- Random bathroom checks are made throughout the day by administrators, teachers, and custodians.
- Yard supervisors are posted outside each restroom during recess times.
- All restrooms will have a "two students at a time" rule enforced.
- 6-8<sup>th</sup> grade students will not use the restroom during instructional time unless monitored by their classroom teacher.

# **Recess Monitoring Procedures**

- Yard supervisors report to recess duty two minutes prior to students' arrival.
- Students are monitored by teachers and yard supervisors when exiting to recess.
- Yard supervisors are strategically placed throughout playground zones, at restrooms, and at hallway entrances.

# Central School Anti-bullying Plan 2017-18

- Playground zones are designed and followed to separate students of differing age groups.
- Structured Alternative Recesses are utilized and monitored, such as the Wolf Den, Wolf Retreat, Wolves in Training, and Thinking Track.

# **Bully Monitoring and Tracking Procedures:**

- Bi-weekly "Coordination of Student Services Meetings" between Site Administration & SRR Social Services
- Behavior Support Plans (Behavior Analysis Process) and Behavioral SST Process
- Discipline Advantage Packets used by Teachers and Site Administration
- "Harassment Order to Cease and Desist" Contracts signed
- Initial Parent Contact by teachers during the first two weeks of school to create an "Open Communication Line"
- Regular Communication to Parents Regarding Student Behaviors (Teachers & Site Administration)
- Staff/Parent/Student Bullying surveys conducted.

# **Bully Reporting Procedures**

- All employees are required to report bullying incidents to the office immediately.
- Students and parents are encouraged to use the Bullying Hotline.
- Students are encouraged to fill out "Incident Reports," tell an adult immediately, or have parents contact site administration.
- Students who report or combat bullying are given "Wolf Rights" tickets or "Positive Office Referrals."
- Morning Announcement Recognition is given to students who combat bullying.






